2. Although I think the Barony's drive for authenticity is a good thing I do think that it can make it hard for newcomers who have no kit and no skills to improve it.  
Instead of simply criticising offer to fix the problem (though this in itself can be fraught)
3. And related to point two, a general reminder that what we do is for fun. I think the group have lost sight of this and they don't seem to be able to see how anachronistic it is to hold a tourney under a bunch of gum trees.  
I've had some people get so hung up about the 'look' of a hall that they fail to see the funny side of holding a medieval feast in a 20<sup>th</sup> C hall where we sit on plastic chairs.

I think most of my suggestions are born from beginning my SCA adventure in another group which plays very differently to Ynys Fawr where awards are given out at almost every event and every newcomer is given a gift of garb to both welcome and encourage them to return and start making accurate garb.

When I moved to Ynys Fawr I expected every group to play the same way and this is simply not the case.

I'm not saying that one way is better than another it's just what I noticed.
