I have sent David a copy of the Newcomers e-mail notification sheet to take to demos so people can be notified of upcoming activities.

A discussion was had about starting a Hobart "IMOT"/"Baronial Day". A small semi-formal gathering / training / collegia once a month where people come in costume undertake one or more activities like collegia / training followed by a small pot luck dinner and end around 6-6:30. This gives a medieval themed gathering once a month for people to come to. I feel it would be best if this is held every month where possible so we can always tell new people that it is happening, like social night etc.

Iron Key:

I have sanded 2 pairs of elbows and sanded and hammered back in to shape a munitions vambrace. I need to paint these with kill rust, strap and pad them.

The 2 shield gloves that Dave and I worked on need to be sealed with wax and then have a buckle added.

I have not been able to make the trip to country leather to purchase more buckles and strapping leather. I also need to get to K&D to purchase a small container of kill rust - any preference on colour? Navy blue?

A Note from the Steward: I should let the barony know formally that I'm not intending that the investiture will be a money maker. With the cost of venues and food, we will make a loss on the order of a couple of hundred dollars. I know you and I have talked about this and we agree that it makes sense to use baronial funds to hold an event like this that's less expensive and more accessible to more people, especially newcomers, so I believe this is the right thing to do. I mention it so nobody will think afterwards that I stuffed up. This is the way it should be.

A Note from the Seneschal: In the original Event submission Eric and I were trying to keep the cost as low as possible in order to get as many people to come along this first major event for Lightwood, bearing in mind the distance people have to travel and accommodation. I believe we have around 46 people booked and that break even is around 60, we should make a small profit after that. I understand some of us may be concerned about making a loss, but I am sure we will get close to break even, there are still a number of people who are going that have not booked.

Business Carried Forward

New Flyers and Newcomers Contact Details Form

It was suggested that we have flyers available at every event and training session with all our contact details. And a form to record any newcomers details so we can do follow up, put them in touch with our website, facebook and let them know when events are coming up etc.

This has been done and being produced.

Action: Still need to create a newcomers form. (Dan Has made progress with this.)

Grant

It was suggested that we place an application for a Grant from the Clarence Council.

It was suggested that we could expect to receive up to 50% reimbursement of the cost for an event, item etc.

Maximum of \$1500 for a \$3000 dollar outlay. It was also suggested that we approach the Tasmanian Government for the \$500 sporting Activities Grant.

David Beresford suggested that we could look at doing the Seafarers Event with the Clarence City Council and say we need a new Period Pavilion for say \$3000.00 with the Clarence City Council to put in 50% of the cost!

David Beresford began the process with CCC and spoke with Kingdom Seneschal with regards to the applying for the grant and was informed this sort of thing had to go through the BOD.

Action: David Beresford to complete application and send through to the BOD ASAP ready for submission in March.

At the last Baronial Meeting a motion was carried to purchase a small pavilion through Lorix for \$100 along with \$48 for four weights. As yet this has not occurred.

Welcome Newcomers

Dan suggested that we make a welcome token or coin similar to the Rowany Tokens, (but with a boat and around the size of a twenty cent piece) to give to Newcomers. Dan also suggested we could approach Armour & Castings, Billy & Charlie

Action: Dan to investigate and report back at the next meeting.

Another suggestion was that we could make Hoods as the Barony has plenty of Wool.

Action: Lorix to Champion the Hood making project.

NB: How is this progressing?

David Beresford suggested that bottle bags were always a useful and welcomed gift to receive by any Newcomer. Alice Finlayson and David Beresford have both offered to make some in the future.

Insurance Policy on the Shed

It was suggested that as we now own the Archery Shed it may be wise to get some contents insurance against fire and theft at least.

Action: Wendy Calabria has offered to obtain at least two or three quotes for Fire & Theft for around \$10,000 coverage.

Wooden Tables from Ian

Ian has six large wooden tables for sale at a total cost of \$300, does the Barony want them?

It was suggested that we could make use of two of them for High Table, but we would not need more than this. This has not been actioned! We still need to get these from Ian along with the nuts and bolts for the Thrones.

Action: Ian has accepted a \$100 for two of the tables could we please cut a cheque.

Boffer Training

David Beresford noted the drop in our minor membership, he has suggested we try to do more for kids on a regular basis, maybe boffer training in preparation for invest where we can have a boffer tournament first prior to the main event? Would anybody like to take this on? Reverse that our minor membership has doubled since last meeting. There is still a need to do more for kids.

Book Keeper

I would like to propose to the Barony the following; without the major offices such as Seneschal and Reeve, there is no official group, and any official group would be suspended if it did not have people representing these offices. The Reeve office is seen to be, by many people, a difficult office in that you are responsible for accurate account keeping and reporting, and it is felt by many that it is a specialist field. Our current Reeve has held her position for at least 2 years and she is due a rest, and there seems to be nobody willing to take on the responsibility after her.

Past Reeves in the Barony have been able to do double entry book keeping, and it has been assumed by many that this is a requirement of a Reeve. While this seems appropriate as a desired skill, it is obvious there are not enough people in the Barony who are able to do this and represent a large enough pool of talent from which to represent the Office. It is simply unfair to expect this limited pool of people to stay caught inside this revolving door, we need to make the office easier to do so that anyone can feel confident about taking it on, with or without any book keeping experience or knowledge.

As a solution I suggest that the Barony should seriously (urgently?) consider it would be worth spending a small amount to hire a book keeper to do our quarterly reports. This would leave the Reeve's duties as similar to any event steward, to keep the receipts and invoices, bank moneys and keep everything (in a shoebox at worst) to give the accountant at the end of each quarter and know that the proper book keeping records will be done and keep the Kingdom Reeve happy. With taking out the assumed requirement of book keeping ability, the Reeve position becomes a lot easier and more open to a larger pool of people who may be willing to do the job.

Hopefully this might be a good idea? Please consider this proposal as a matter of importance.

New Business

Pavilions

Subject to our successful grant application David Beresford has obtained the following for the Barony's consideration.

1. Double Bell Pavilion

For the 6m x 3m type tent, here is a design similar to what you would get -

We could get this tent or something similar for around \$3200 within Australia.



OR

2. 6 x Sunshades

Like the Stormhold Sunshades

Basic natural (off-white) coloured sunshades with hand sewn leather grommets and no decoration for \$2900. The price includes spliced ropes, tent pegs, poles and bags. Each sunshade would be 5m x 3m and the 24 timber poles would be 2.1m long with 12 metal extenders to raise the front poles for better water shedding.

The total useful area is 2.5m x 3m with a storage area about 1m wide at the back.

Alternatively, we could just make the sunshades and you could arrange pegs, poles and ropes. This would be \$1800.

We could also add decoration; either the trimmed semicircles like on the Innilgard tent along the front edge, or use two colours like the Stormhold sunshades. This would cost an extra \$200. We haven't done much investigation, but yellow canvas is not obviously available.

We haven't included transport in these prices as we could possibly send them across with someone. Otherwise, you will need to cover transport costs.



OR

3. **3 x Double Bell Wedge Tent**

Available from Medieval Fight Club, this is 12 feet long ridge beam and 8 feet high poles required.

Supplied with ropes and instructions on how to make the poles. Pegs are not supplied, 16 pegs are required for the bottom of the tent. 2 additional pegs are required for the ropes. Floor area: over 4m x 2m. Packed weight: 16kg

NOTE: The tents are made with REAL heavy duty (14 ozpy - 475 gsm) canvas and not a synthetic polyester or ripstop fabric. REAL cotton ropes (not nylon) are supplied.

Closure at Cambridge

Kingdom Seneschal Report

Greetings all,

Welcome to the September state of the nation.

The Good News

Numbers: Lochacs numbers jumped by 17% in the last quarter - 19% in AU and 4% in NZ.

This is very encouraging after the downward trend in both countries over the past few quarters. I was going to attribute Australia's jump to the recent changes to event memberships but the numbers have been increasing steadily all quarter from well before those changes were announced.

Most groups are showing positive growth for the first time in several quarters and also good activity levels and somewhat less grouching. Marshallate authorisations are generally up a bit too.

The baronies numbers are also interesting. Lochac has 12 baronies.

Rowany is again the largest with 150; they have been trading top spot with Aneala for some time now.

Aneala and Politarchopolis round out the super-baronies with 141 and 140.

Then we have River Haven and Stormhold both over 100, then a large gap to the standard baronies.

We have five baronies in the 60s with another just below that.

So the baronies are fairly evenly split into two distinct sizes: large 110-150 and standard 55-75.

Make of this what you will.

Pegasus: Following the changes to the way members can access Pegasus made earlier in the year, and a couple of tweaks since, Pegasus downloads have almost quadrupled meaning the newsletter now ties with the Announce mailing list for our most widely read publication.

Blackfox Awards: Lochac did quite well with several finalists in the Blackfox awards:

Best Overall Newsletter: From the Tower, Barony of Southron Gaard, Kingdom of Lochac, Chronicler: Mrn Johansdottir.

Best Special Issue: Foli Roani, Barony of Rowany, Kingdom of Lochac,
Chronicler: Lady Dragana Rzsa (Newsletter for newcomers).

Best Article: Making easy fabric ties by Alliette Delecourt, Stormscroll, Barony of Stormhold, Kingdom of Lochac.

Honourable Mention: Lady Rosamond de Montfort, The Rhol, Canton of Abertridwr.& Lady Dragana Rzsa, Foli Roani, Barony of Rowany.

Were still waiting to hear who actually won.

Equestrian: The Board of SCA Ltd and the Equestrian Marshal have added Jousting, Crest Combat and Mounted Combat to the list of activities covered by our insurance.

GST: We've made it through our first reporting quarter with GST and submitted our BAS. Some groups did it in style, some did it with less style and a few barely made it through BUT, as far as I've heard, no-one died and I'm counting that as a win. Well done!

Insurance: So far, it seems most groups are adapting to the changes, which is a credit to the officers who have managed them. I would very much like to know if you have had any difficulties with the new systems or if there are any questions about them.

The Bad News

Arrowsreach

The Board has, with great sadness, made the decision to close the Shire of Arrowsreach. The Board's decision was that the lands and assets of the Shire revert to the Barony of Stormhold. The shire has been struggling to maintain its core officers and its enthusiasm. The group polled on its status and, while the majority would have preferred to become a canton of Stormhold, a significant minority voted to close the group and return to Stormhold. Since the group could not fill its required offices, the Board had no choice but to close it.

Financial Reporting

The Board has just placed two baronies, two shires and a canton on probation for poor financial reporting. The idea is to provide closer monitoring and extra mentoring to help these groups get up to speed.

SCA Ltd has to report on the financial activity for all of its groups every quarter. We have 30 groups in Australia, not including colleges. If every one of them misses only one report in 30 (one every 7.5 years), then SCA Ltds report will never be complete. Too many incomplete reports and we attract the attention of the ATO, which is bad. Were in the big leaguenow.

Other News

Law Changes:

Their Majesties, Siridean and Margie, proclaimed changes to the entry requirements for Crown Tournaments at Midwinter Coronation and added a reference to the Crown Travel Fund policy.

Their Majesties, Henri and Beatrice, proclaimed changes regarding Event Memberships to bring Kingdom Law into line with the SCA Ltd Boards new policies as required by the insurer.

Recently our group was informed of upcoming changes to our arrangement at Cambridge Hall and the Archery Grounds below the Cricket Field.

I am aware your know a little of what we are about, but I thought I would just give you a bit more of background about the SCA (Society for Creative Anachronism) and our group The Barony of Ynys Fawr.

It is an international organisation dedicated to researching and re-creating the arts, skills, and traditions of pre-17th-century Europe.

The SCA consists of 19 "Kingdoms", with over 30,000 members residing in Countries around the World. The group based in Tasmania (The Society for Creative Anachronism Ltd - TAS) more commonly known as The Barony of Ynys Fawr. We currently have around 72 financial Members in TAS. Members of the SCA study and take part in a variety of activities, including Armoured Combat, Target Archery, Equestrian Activities, Costuming, Cooking, Metalwork, Woodworking, Music, Dance, Calligraphy, Sewing, Embroidery, and much more. If it was done in the Middle Ages or Renaissance, odds are you'll find someone in the SCA interested in recreating it.

We are a not for profit organisation who currently pays approximately \$3000 a year to the Clarence City Council to conduct our activities such as Armoured Combat, Target Archery and Rapier on the field below the Cricket Oval. While in the Hall we practice things such as Costuming, Music, Singing, Dance, Calligraphy, Sewing and Embroidery to name a few. From time to time throughout the year we hold different events such as Feasts and Tourney's.

This enables us to keep our Members and community participant's costs low and accessible to a broad section of the community.

I understand we will need to move our Groups Training Activities in the near future and would ask the Council if they have somewhere where we can hold our regular Combat Training and Target Archery, with an enclosed area for those members who wish to practice the finer arts, toilets, as well as a secure storage area. A Hall with kitchen facilities would be bonus but is not a requirement.

I know we have been given the option of doing something at Lauderdale but we feel this location will limit our Members and the greater community's participation within our group.
