Insurance Policy on the Shed

It was suggested that as we now own the Archery Shed it may be wise to get some contents insurance against fire and theft at least. Wendy's findings!

After spending some time on searching for an insurer, any insurer who would cover the shed at Cambridge and its contents, I have drawn a total blank.

I have called 7 different insurers and been given two different websites to visit, but no one appears to cover the situation that the Society is in with regard to insuring a shed that is not used as a home, or not used for

commercial purposes, on land that is not owned by us. I also attempted to add it to our own policy but that is also not possible.

The companies I have initially contacted are: AAMI 132244 / Budget Direct, CGU 132481, RACT 132722, GIO 131010, Suncorp 131155 & Shannons 134646

The two websites are: <u>www.niba.com.au</u> and <u>www.insurancecouncil.com.au</u>

I have also contacted the insurance council of Australia via a phone call (on 1300884934) and they have rung me with three options, one of which have already said "no" (CGU). The other two are Elders on 135622 and Vero on 131813. They also do not cover the shed unless it is on land owned by us. Shannon, the lady from the insurance council of Australia said that she is almost 100% sure that we would have to go through a broker to get any coverage at all for the shed and contents.

I also rang the insurance brokers line on 1300531073 with no result to date from them. I will contact them again or go back to ask the insurance council if they have any more ideas when I have time, sometime in the new year. But it does not look too good as to finding anyone, but I am not giving up.

Thank you for all your efforts Wendy.

The conclusion is that until we have a dedicated storage address, either owned or rented we will be unable to gain insurance for Baronial Gear.

SCA Spec Armour Drop Tester

Darren West has asked the group to review this SCA Spec Armour Drop Tester from Darkwood Armory! <u>http://www.darkwoodarmory.com/index.php?main_page=product_info&products_id=62</u> \$55.00



The SCA published a method for testing fencing armour in its 2006 website at SCA.org. It uses a Meyer standard 1/8" drop pin on a heavy tube, and its drop height was designed to exert 1.5 Joules of force onto the material being tested -- a much more scientifically accurate system than banging the armour into the dirt with a broken foil.

The set comes with the tube and clamps designed to hold the material being tested, the drop tube, and a specific Meyer-tipped drop weight to be used ONLY with the same tube. Each tube and weight are individually marked to make sure sets remain together. It also comes with a copy straight from SCA.org of the directions, and a red bag to contain all the bits.

You can make one of your own; the information is free on the SCA website. However, Meyer will require that you order ten pins minimum and the cost at Lowe's for all the PVC was about \$41 each. We are offering these testers more as a service to those who might not have the capacity to build their own.

This along with a Safety Tester for Fencing Masks will be voted on next meeting.

The Kingdom Seneschal's Report

Numbers: Lochac continues to grow, at least in Australia. Australian memberships are up 18% from 1136 last quarter to 1345. NZ memberships are up from 136 to 137. Overall that's a 16.5% increase for the Kingdom. NZ's numbers are 19% down on this time last year while AU's are up 31%.

Growth in AU started in March and has continued at a steady rate through the year until this month when it began to plateau. Pretty much all Australian groups have benefitted from the growth.

The largest three groups are: Rowany 178 / Politarchopolis 160 / Aneala 147

US Newsletters: Lochac has moved a little closer to the rest of the Known World. Pegasus is now available for SCA members in other kingdoms to read online and Lochac SCA members now have access to the newsletters of all other kingdoms. It's a good place to look for ideas and inspiration.

Same-Sex Couples: I think we've all heard by now that the US BOD has changed Corpora to allow same-sex couples to contest Crown Tournaments with the specific permission of the relevant Crown. The Society Seneschal has ruled that any Kingdom laws which still mirror the old Corpora prohibition are now in conflict with Corpora and therefore null and void. We already have at least one same-sex baronage in Caid.

Comment on the BOD's second proposal to prevent anyone entering Crown Tournament as both competitor and consort closes on March 1.

Abertridwr for Barony: The Canton of Abertridwr has been given the final green light to become a barony. They are about to enter the process of choosing their first Baron and Baroness.

Quarterly Reporting for All: The Society Seneschal has just proposed requiring quarterly reporting from all local seneschals. His intention was to reduce the reporting requirements. It seems that most Kingdoms require monthly reporting. I've put this to the local seneschals and the Kingdom Officers to, surprisingly, resounding support. So, pending Royal approval, quarterly reporting for all group officers is likely to start in 2013.

Odd Facts: There are three baronies with more members than all of New Zealand -Rowany, Politarchopolis and Aneala. 16% of Lochac's adult members live in a shire. Shires do not fall into distinct size bands like baronies do. They seem to more evenly cover the size distribution from 8 to 51 (7 to 38 adult members). Shires have more kids than baronies. The percentage of minors in shires ranges from 8.3% to a whopping 43.3% with an average of 21.6%. That's 1.3 times as many minors as the average barony.

Good Ideas: New Officers- Many groups are reporting difficulty finding deputies to train up as replacement officers. Here are a couple of things you can try:

1. Encourage officers at-large. Marshals, constables, listkeepers, heralds, chirurgeons and hospitallers all have at-large options of a more or less official nature. The more at-large officers you have trained up the more the work can be spread around rather than loaded onto the group officer. It also gives people some qualifications and experience which sets them up for holding the relevant group office in the future.

2. Try advertising for a new officer, not a deputy, and then have the old officer stay on as the deputy. There's only so much you can do or learn as a deputy. It's quite different when you're actually the officer. It's also not necessary, or even desirable, for some people who've done the office before to go through a mandatory deputy period before taking over. And there is no guarantee that your deputy will be appointed as your successor by your upline. With the outgoing officer as their deputy the new officer has someone they can feel happy to call on for advice and support.

Fighter Courses: Organised beginner, and now intermediate, fighter training courses are becoming de rigueur along the East Coast and showing excellent results, for group numbers as well as fighting skill. If your group doesn't have one, consider how you might get one.

Children's Activities: The Children's Deputy has some ideas for entertaining children with simple activities that can be put into a snap lock bags such as a lucet, thread and basic instructions, peg dolls, illumination etc.

Suggestion Book: Bacchus Wood has had a few good ideas come through a suggestion book left around at meetings.

Business Cards: Several groups are trialling business cards for the first time. Those groups which use them find them a worthwhile return on investment. How many of the people you've talked to in the street or at an event have ever been able to find the SCA again if they didn't have our name written down? Get cards and give them to everyone.

A couple of groups are using QR codes on business cards and posters. Aneala has had a reasonable hit rate on the website from these and can monitor which poster in which location got the hit so they can find out what's working.

Group Livery: Several groups have group livery projects of a sort - specific colours, badges, brooches, etc. These can be good for group morale and loyalty but need to work with a variety of styles of garb.

A&S Display Table: Stormhold is trying an A&S display table at events where people can display their projects, especially works in progress, and people can come and ask questions and get advice and inspiration for their next project. This has been well received.

Welcome Table: St Florian is experimenting with a welcome table at events as a point to direct newcomers and onlookers to.

Import Talent: I think everyone agrees that it's good to meet new people and see new ways of doing things. Not everyone can travel around the Kingdom. But if Mohammed cannot go to the mountain, we have ways of bringing the mountain to Mohammed. The Stronger Kingdom Fund exists to help groups import talent to fill gaps in their knowledge. That might be a duke to help your mid-level fighters go up a level, or a costuming laurel to help the people working on Elizabethan wardrobes, or a don to get your rapier fighters out of their bad habits. Please give some thought to what your group needs and how you might be able to get it. There are several funds in Lochac that can help you.

Plan Your (insert large event here) Wardrobe: One group is running a plan your Festival wardrobe course. No matter what time or place you prefer everyone needs several outfits for Festival that can cope with Festival conditions and there's something to be said for working on that in a group.

Things to Think About

Crown Events: We average around one bid per Crown event, which is enough but only barely. The most popular event is November Crown, followed by Midwinter, then May Crown, then Twelfth Night. Twelfth Night averages no bids and begging is usually required.

So if you have a small group or a very different idea and think you'd like to try running a Kingdom event but couldn't possibly compete against the larger baronies then think about a Twelfth Night or a May Crown.

If you think your group can't do it, Adora just ran a successful November Crown with less than 20 members. They report that they will benefit from the shiny new things they made for the event and also from the renewed enthusiasm within the group which comes partly from successfully undertaking something like this and partly from the inspiration so many visitors can bring.

For the record, based on population size, WA and Queensland are behind on percentages and should bid for more events.
