The Canton of Lightwood Seneschal: Adelindis filia Gotefridi (Liz Williamson)

Activity resumed in Lightwood with the first Imot on the 19th January, followed by Imots on the 2nd and 16th of February. Times for fighter training and archery were agreed on, with training being weekly on Wednesdays at 5:30pm in Rotary Park, Huonville, and archery on alternate Saturdays to the Imots (starting March 9) at Surges Bay Hall. We are hoping that the visibility of fighter training will help recruiting; to that end we have flyers available for any passers-by. We have also met up in garb for a BBQ dinner before training, which may be repeated.

For archery, the canton now has custody of two bows from the Barony, thanks to Anselm de Calabria, and several members have their own, but in order to be able to run practice independent of whether the Barony's archery marshals are free and willing to come down and lend us blunts, we will need to build a stock of our own. Anselm has kindly run a workshop on making blunts at our Imot on Feb 2nd, so the canton should be able to hold working bees in future, and our Captain of Archers, William de Bonnay, has been investigating prices for purchasing the materials. We would like to put a proposal to the Barony to defray some of the expenses of the materials purchases (we have also discussed alternate funding sources). The breakdown of expenses is attached.

The first event run by the Canton this year will be the camping weekend at Surges Bay Hall over Easter, including a catered feast on Saturday night.

They were drawn from a storyline I made up and included original sketches by myself and Baron Lucas, Viking translations were supplied by Baron Snorri and they were painted on calico by numerous people of the Barony who were willing to lend a hand. They have been displayed at that weekend event and at GSG, and photos have been taken for posterity. Bran and Lilia were very pleased we went to the effort and they do like them a lot, and were gifted with a photo disc of them from Nick and Wendy.

Currently the murals are stored in my hall linen closet. I worry they will never again see the light of day. They will always be about Bran and Lilia's visit. Some time ago I was told by Lilia, that Bran was diagnosed with an illness that had lethal potential. It's been a few months since I heard, and I have no idea of how things are now for his health.

I was wondering if perhaps Lilia would like to have the murals as a gift to commemorate their reign, so I thought I would see what the Barony membership thinks about that? Funding Opportunity for Community Organisations

The Tasmanian Community Fund invites organisations to apply for grants under our latest general grant round 26, which opens today.

Eligible applicants: Not-for-profit organisations proposing to undertake a project in Tasmania.

Eligible projects: A wide range of projects which support children and young people; community wellbeing and life skills; community participation and recreation; connecting communities; and culture, arts and heritage.

Funding available: Around \$2.5 million is available for allocation this round.

There are three funding streams – small grants up to \$10 000; medium grants \$10 001 to \$90 000; and, large grants \$100 000 to \$300 000.

Most of our grants are for small to medium amounts up to \$50 000. We may award grants up to \$300 000 in some circumstances.

How to apply: Applicants should provide the information requested in the guidelines by the closing date. Guidelines and access to the link for the on-line application and expression of interest forms are available from our website at www.tascomfund.org. For a hard copy of the guidelines or the forms email <u>admin@tascomfund.org</u> or phone the Fund Office on 6233 2920. Closing date: Expressions of interest for large grants close on 27 February 2013. Applications for small grants close on 20 March 2013 and applications for medium grants close on 3 April 2013. We will not accept late applications.

Assessment: Our grant rounds are highly competitive and we are unable to support every worthwhile project. Organisations are strongly encouraged to contact Fund staff early in the process to discuss their proposed application.

We will advise all applicants in writing of the assessment decision by mid-June. Funding decisions are final.

You may notice when you log in to do your reports that there is now a link called "Manage Group Email Aliases".

This clever little link will allow you to set up email aliases for all of your group officers along the lines of <u>seneschal@aneala.lochac.sca.org</u> or <u>constable@riverhaven.lochac.sca.org</u> and have them forward email to the relevant officer's personal email address.

They mean that you can now put on your website that you can be contacted at

<u>seneschal@group.lochac.sca.org</u> rather than having to put your personal address onto a website where every bot will trawl it and spam you forever. Spam could still happen, but only while you're in office, not forever after. It also means that you can put an address onto your website, newsletter, business cards, etc and never, ever have to change it again.

It does make it the seneschal's job to update the aliases whenever your officers change.

So far this system will work for Bacchus Wood, Krae Glas, St Andronicus, Radburne, Rowany, Stegby, River Haven, Stowe, and Politarchopolis, mostly because they have people on the Masonry team.

If your group is not on this list and you want to do this, please ask me to set up a domain name for your group.

Once the domain is created, the instructions for setting up addresses are on the webpage. "Alias" is the officer@group address. "Destination Address" is the person's personal email address. Give it a couple of hours for the system to process it then send a test message to the new alias to make sure it works. Let me know if you have any problems. Upcoming Purchases

Nicholas Calabria is in the process of ordering Fibre Tape and Blunts!

1. Fibre Tape (27 mm width) (I am placing an order for Fibre tape (27 mm width) and recommend that the Barony place an order as well. This width tape is excellent for covering 8 mm diameter arrows (blunts) for combat. The tape could also be used for wrapping weapons although I am not recommending it for that at this stage. The tape is expected to be about \$7.00 per roll (including postage and handling). I suggest that we order 10 rolls for the Barony ie \$70. These orders seem to only go in every two years or so. I am not sure if this is the first time mentioned. I think it may have been raised at the last meeting.)

2. Blunts (for SCA combat) (I am placing an order for SCA legal Blunts as used on combat arrows in Lochac. This time the Blunts cost \$1.30 each plus P&H which I estimate to come to \$1.50 per Blunt. This is the first price rise for Blunts in about 5 or more years so this is not too bad. I am recommending that the Barony order some blunts like it did last time (many years ago). Last time I ordered 700 Blunts with the Barony ordering, I think, 300. This time the order is nowhere as big. I suggest that the Barony order 100 Blunts. This is 100 x \$1.50 = \$150. I think this is the first time Blunts have been mentioned for purchase but I could be wrong on this.

Seneschal: How many blunts does the Barony have on hand? Do we need to make arrows ASAP? This really should be carried through to the next meeting, unless it is really urgent.

Stronger Kingdom Fund

The Council of the Purse welcomes submissions for assistance under the Stronger Kingdom Fund. Submissions may be made throughout the year and will each be considered on a case by case basis.

The concept is to help bring expert visitors from other groups, to harness their energy and expertise.

The kingdom will fund up to \$500 towards the travel costs of brining a visiting expert to the group. It is understood that actual travel costs may be higher than this, any further funding should be done by the group either through attendance charges for the event or other fund-raising. It could also be worthwhile asking Rowany for assistance from their Fighter Auction Fund, applying to the Laurels for 'Laurel Freedom Bus' funding, or seeking contributions from other SCA groups in your region.

By "experts", we mean members of the peerages (knights, laurels, pelicans) or the polling orders (archers, fencers). If your real need is a herald or an equestrian who is not a peer, write in with your case and the Council may consider your proposal anyway.

Your submission should fit on one A4 page, in MS Word or OpenOffice, and should include a description of your need, then how your proposed solution will address this. The submission can be generic ("seeking funds for 3 laurels covering costuming, brewing and thaumaturgy") or specific ("for Sir Cumfrance and his armouring trailer").

The fund's guidelines are that there is a planned Kingdom expenditure of \$1500 per calendar year. Once this budget has been allocated in a calendar year, then subsequent applications on the fund will be unlikely to be granted. There may be more groups seeking assistance than the funds available, so it's helpful if you can demonstrate value for money. For instance, if you hire a minibus, it may be possible to bring extra peers and perhaps some laurel apprentices or squires to help. It may be that one Laurel can offer several sessions to address more than one need.

Or you could get letters of support (email fine) from nearby groups to demonstrate that they will attend and maximise the benefit.

Once assistance under the fund has been approved, reimbursement can be made to the group upon presentation of receipts up to the maximum value awarded.

This policy is subject to review at any time.
