

GREAT SOUTHERN GATHERING

The agreement will be between the Baronies of Innilgard and Ynys Fawr and the Shire of Krae Glas.

The basic premise of the GSG is to have fun, learn stuff and get together. A casual atmosphere is to be aimed for. Court is not expected to happen unless there is an outstanding reason for it (like the K&Q are there and want one).

The event will always be held on the first weekend in October.

All advertising needs to reflect that the event is jointly owned and run by the Barony of Innilgard, the Barony of Ynys Fawr and the Shire of Krae Glas.

The event will always have classes in rapier and A&S, adding classes in heavy as well if teachers can be found.

Site preference is residential, with bunks and camping possible. A camp-fire circle is to be sought for.

Long distance travellers have preference for bunks up to a nominated cut off date after which they are open to all. If there are plenty of bunks it may not be a problem.

Preferred sites should be reasonably close to the airport or organisers should offer some means of transport for those flying in.

In keeping with the casual theme of the event, each group has the choice to make the Saturday garb optional, with the Saturday night and Sunday being garbed. OH&S rules would apply if classes require specific clothing to be worn that is not garb.

All offers of teaching should be accepted as long as the topics do not contravene SCA, mundane or OH&S rules.

The group that hosts the event finances it and takes any profit or loss. It may be possible to reserve profits for a future GSG to allow OS teachers to attend.

While the hosting group is in charge of the logistics, organisational assistance from members of the other two groups is most welcome both before the event and during it. In order to keep the 'shared' aspect of the event, stewards should seek team members from the other two groups where it is possible (eg class lists creator, marshals in charge and so on).

Stewarding Team – these people need to be in touch with the other two groups through the Seneschals and Barons and Baronesses of the groups.
