Proposed Events

Yule Feast - Date to be advised

The Event is a Yule feast, hopefully in October, may also include the Ostmark Ball. I've yet to look into booking, however we are going to look at Carnaco for the night as it will mean that no one has to drive home unless they want to. **themed 1500's**. site to open 3pm and close approximately 3pm the next day. There will be **prizes** for best garb, entertainment and sweet dish and a raffle on the night.

The budget for the Yule Feast is fairly simple

We decided to charge a flat rate of \$50 per adult person, \$12 for children under the age of 5yrs and \$30 for those between the ages of 5-18yrs.

Half of which is to go towards booking, fees and levies, cleaning products, prizes and memberships, and as we are thinking of having the event as a 'sleep- over', to avoid the trouble of driving home, the camp 'sleeping' levy (\$12.00 per person regardless of age).

The rest will go to buy food for the feast and the following breakfast and lunch.

Any profit we hope can be put towards purchasing fencing and archery equipment in the North.

Business Carried Forward

Cambridge Hall and Archery Grounds

Thankyou Betty for having the initiative to chase this most important issue up

Kingdom have sent their approval for Ynys Fawr to have a contract with Clarence Council for the hire of the Archery grounds at Cambridge based on a prospective hire cost of \$70. This has been forwarded onto Tracey Sparks Property Officer for the Clarence City Council, Tracy will arrange for this to be executed by council and an invoice to be forwarded shortly.

Cambridge Hall Payments

General Equipment Maintenance.

If we maintain a repair kit at Cambridge there will be no need to have petty cash for armour repairs. Please see new business.

Marquee for sale

David Beresford investigated the Marquee that is for sale along with Daniel Russel. Although cheap it was found to be in poor repair with numerous patches and a large oil stain. With a lot of elbow grease and some extra money spent it would be an average Marquee. Ropes would be required to be replaced as well additional large pegs purchased. It requires up to six people to set it up.

Query the viability of this purchase when for a little more money a purchase could be made of something that is light, easy to erect and with some smart decorating could change a modern pavilion into a medieval one. I recommend we should investigate other options.

Raffles

David Beresford has made some enquiries into the legalities of holding a raffle. As long as it is for a non profit organisation, the prize is under \$5000 and ticket sales do not exceed more than 5 times the value of the prize then a licence is not required. However before a raffle can be organised it has to be approved by Seneschal.

- 1. Two sets of shoulders
- 2. Two Sets of Bracers
- 3. Two C Belts for Leg Harness (These can be brought of the rack for \$60 a pair)
- 4. A set of small Knees
- 5. Two Shield Gloves
- 6. Two Shield Elbows

The following materials would be needed in addition to the above.

Stage 2: Body Armour

 NB: Betty North has recently upgraded one of the loaner gambesons and is in the process of making one or two others with tie on sleeves.
