The main demo we have done has been the Derwent valley Festival which has helped to create a positive profile of the SCA in the Tasmanian community. ## **Business Carried Forward**

### **Cambridge Hall and Archery Grounds**

Thankyou Betty for having the initiative to chase this most important issue up

Kingdom have sent their approval for Ynys Fawr to have a contract with Clarence Council for the hire of the Archery grounds at Cambridge based on a prospective hire cost of \$70. This has been forwarded onto Tracey Sparks Property Officer for the Clarence City Council, Tracy will arrange for this to be executed by council and an invoice to be forwarded shortly.

### **Cambridge Hall Payments**

A post office box is currently being set up for receipt of such invoices by Ian.

Now awaiting Kingdom approval. TBA. Is there any reason it has to be Bellerive?

Query possibility of installing a PO Box at Moonah Post Office, mail will then be forwarded to the Seneschal. This gives the group a static address. This was approved at a previous meeting for Bellerive.

### **General Equipment Maintenance.**

If there is a repair kit maintained at Cambridge there will be no need to have petty cash for armour repairs. Please see new business.

### **Marquee for sale**

David Beresford investigated the Marquee that is for sale along with Daniel Russel. Although cheap it was found to be in poor repair with numerous patches and a large oil stain. With a lot of elbow grease and some extra money spent it would be an average Marquee. Ropes would be required to be replaced as well additional large pegs purchased. It requires up to six people to set it up.

Query the viability of this purchase when for a little more money a purchase could be made of something that is light, easy to erect and with some smart decorating could change a modern pavilion into a medieval one. I recommend we should investigate other options.

It was decided that this was not a viable option.

**Action:** David Beresford invites those that are interested to investigate alternative options and bring them to the next meeting.

## Raffles

David Beresford has made some enquiries into the legalities of holding a raffle. As long as it is for a non profit organisation, the prize is under \$5000 and ticket sales do not exceed more than 5 times the value of the prize then a licence is not required. However before a raffle can be organised it has to be approved by Seneschal. A copy of the Gaming Control Act 1993 from the Tasmanian Gaming Commission was tabled.

## New Business

### New Loaner Armour and Repair Kit

It has been noted that our loaner armour is in need of some work and that we have very little loaner armour suitable for people of a smaller stature.

After a small amount of discussion with Dan, Nick and David the following options were raised for consideration.

7. Two Piece Rivets (500)	\$ 35.00	
8. Strapping Leather	\$ 0.00	(Dan to source from Country Leather)
9. 20 Buckles (50c each)	\$ 10.00	
10. Foam for helmets etc.	\$ 15.00	
11. Assorted Tape	\$ 10.00	
Total	\$105.00	

It was thought that a variety of combatants could benefit from having:

1. A small to medium suit of Heavy Combatant Armour
2. A medium to large suit of Heavy Combatant Armour
3. And a suit of Combat Archers Armour.

With this in mind we would like to make the following in two stages.

#### Stage 1: Limbs

1. Two sets of shoulders
2. Two Sets of Bracers
3. Two C Belts for Leg Harness (These can be brought of the rack for \$60 a pair)
4. A set of small Knees
5. Two Shield Gloves
6. Two Shield Elbows

The following materials would be needed in addition to the above.

1. A hide of leather	\$150.00
2. Waxed Thread	\$ 20.00
3. C Belts	\$120.00
Total	\$290.00

**Action:** Daniel Russel and David Beresford to discuss a time frame for completing stage one and bring their findings back to the next meeting.

**Action:** David Beresford to ask the list whether there is any unwanted materials available that people may wish to donate.

## Stage 2: Body Armour

1. Two Aluminium Shields (These can be brought off the rack for \$100 each)
2. Coat of Plates
3. Lamellar
4. Sml Light Weight Gambeson (Can be brought off the rack for \$150)

NB: Betty North has recently upgraded one of the loaner gambesons and is in the process of making one or two others with tie on sleeves.

The following materials would be needed in addition to the above.

1. Lamellar Plates x 6sq	\$300.00
2. ABS Plastic Plates	\$200.00
3. Kevlar Cord 500m	\$ 70.00
4. Cotton Drill 20 metres	\$200.00
5. Leather for Rivets	\$ 20.00
6. Cotton Batting	\$ 40.00
7. Cotton Thread	\$ 20.00
8. Miscellaneous Materials	\$150.00
Total	\$1000.00

This is a large proposed amount to be spent on armour (\$1500) and possibly not viable for the group and as such would like the group to consider approval for a budget of \$500 for Stage 1

And then support in raising a further \$1000.00 via a raffle to achieve Stage 2

It was also thought that some of the materials for Stage 1 could be used at the upcoming GSG as part of an armouring workshop to be run by Lord Wulfgar Jarinsiða (Daniel Russel)?

Encourage any suggestions on how this could be made achievable.

David Beresford suggested buying a Long Bow, making a dozen blunts and offering several lessons as the major prize for a raffle to raise \$1000 for Stage 2 of the new Loaner Armour.

Once the prize is collected and the tickets made, David suggested to sell the tickets right up to the Royal Hobart Show through to Saturday the 22nd. Whereby he tickets can then be drawn by (Kim & Dave?)

David also hopes to gain some advertising for the group through the Hobart Show Magazine.
